Challenge

- Lack of capacity and voice of pig value chain actors and stakeholders to influence/contribute to policies that impact the sector.
- Low prioritization of the sector by the government despite growing pork demand and value chain constraints such as poor-quality feeds, diseases including African Swine Fever (ASF), poor pig breeds, and unfavorable prices

Our approach

- Catalyzing the establishment of alliances in the form of pig multi-stakeholder platforms at regional and national levels through partnerships with SNV.
- Capacity building of the MSPs leadership in terms of governance and enhancing skills in platform facilitation.
- Sharing learnings and lessons from MorePork 1 and MorePork2 project interventions to address pressing constraints
- Engage key stakeholder groups.

Results, outcomes, achievements

- Mobilization of collective action to address pressing constraints in the pig sector in Uganda e.g., poor- quality feeds, disease management etc.
- Business linkages between actors in the pig sector have been created /strengthened
- Strengthened private-public sector partnerships. E.g., construction of an abattoir in Masaka - a partnership between the two sector players.

Lessons and significance

- MSPs provide an entry point for various stakeholder groups to engage with pig value chain players e.g. privatepublic sector partnerships, funding agencies, civil society, policy makers, development partners etc.
- The MSPs create networks and avenues for learning, knowledge sharing and empowerment of actors in the pig value chain.
- Private sector leadership and involvement is key for sustainability of MSPs at all levels
